A jury from science, society, and business then decides which "labster" will take part in the final <u>Falling Walls Lab</u> in Berlin in November. There, the best "labsters" from all over the world will compete against each other. The top three will win prize money and the opportunity to present their topics on the big stage of the <u>Falling Walls Conference</u> the next day. At the international conference in Berlin, 100 of the world's leading top researchers will present scientific and social solutions to global challenges such as climate change, energy production, health, safety, and fair and sustainable economy. The aim is to tear down walls and overcome boundaries: in minds, in thinking, and in action.

For the second time already, Karlsruhe Institute of Technology (KIT) is organizing a Falling Walls Lab for Southwest Germany, alternating with Heidelberg University. Three nationwide labs will determine the "labsters" from Germany who will compete in the finals in Berlin.
